Lynn Members Stand Up to Boost Pay Across New England

This September, Local 201 announced that GE Lynn, Mass. members secured a deal to increase pay and stop management from delaying raises for 540 workers hired since 2016. The member-driven effort success-fully reformed a wage progression system implemented by GE in 2016. Under that system, GE could force workers to wait ten or more years before being eligible for the top pay rate, regardless of skills or productivity.

Local 201 members are now eligible for the top pay raise after 6 years along with immediate increases in pay for workers on the progression. In addition, GE Lynn workers now have a say in the process for setting the wage cap, known as the "top of market rate." Local 201's win had a wider effect: GE workers at the non-organized GE factories in Hooksett, New Hampshire and Rutland, Vermont are now eligible for the top pay rate in six years as well, instead of 7-15 years. Pay fairness as well as pay levels are going to be a major issue in upcoming negotiations; Local 201's win is a powerful reminder of what we can accomplish when GE workers stand together.
